The Engineering Alumni Awards celebrate the outstanding contributions to engineering and to society by Alumni of the Faculty of Applied Science & Engineering.

Engineering Alumni Medal

The Engineering Alumni Medal, the highest honour granted by the Engineering Alumni Association, is identified as "For Achievement". High achievement is the common thread distinguishing those on the roll of past recipients of the Medal, all of whom in their diverse careers have responded with flair and excellence to the challenges they faced. Their attainments will be seen as defining the aspirations and professional values of all our alumni.

Hall of Distinction

Induction to the Hall of Distinction recognizes distinguished alumni on the basis of their lifelong accomplishments. These are graduates whose performances, as they followed a wide variety of career paths, have ultimately defined what is most exemplary in our graduates and in our profession. They are role models for our undergraduates about to address the ever-greater challenges of a changing world. The careers of the members stand as examples and add a sense of reality to the aspirations of successive generations of engineering students.

2T5 Mid-career Award

The 2T5 Mid-career Award is presented to a member of the Engineering undergraduate class within 11-25 years of graduation from their undergraduate degree who has earned respect within the profession and in the broader community, and has already attained significant achievement in their career.

7T6 Early Career Award

The 7T6 Early Career Award recognizes a member of the Engineering undergraduate class within 10 years of graduation from their undergraduate degree, who has distinguished themselves in the profession, the community, the university and other related fields, and gives promise of further contributions.

Letters must be a maximum of one page in length (one-sided) and must be focused on the criteria of the award. The nominator is not eligible to submit a letter.

Notes: The guidelines used by the Honours and Awards Committee for scoring nominees is provided as an appendix to the nomination form. Nominees must be living at the time of the close of nominations. Links or references to material external to the nomination are permitted for clarification, but the evaluation process will not rely on this additional information. No self-nominations will be accepted. Nominees who did not complete their undergraduate degree at U of T Engineering are only eligible for the Engineering Alumni Medal, Hall of Distinction or Honorary Alumnus.
