required to submit a summary statement describing the impact of the funding and the
outcomes of their club/event activities based on the four pillars outlined above to the
CPSIF Committee. In addition, you may be required to report on some or all of the
descriptions you have provided on this form. Please keep a copy for your reference.
Description details of what to report in the statement will be included with positive
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decisions only.
All promotional and/or marketing materials should recognize supporting units, which
are: Engineering Society, Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering at the University
of Toronto, Skule Alumni, and/or specific departments / divisions (logos to be
distributed upon funding approval).
Please keep CPSIF Committee staff apprised of all of your organization's events and
projects, especially of the activities in which you will involve alumni.
The student club charter (or constitution) must be made available to the CPSIF
 Committee upon request.
